Membership

Our Troop currently has just over 50 Scouts (who attend Belmont Ridge, Brambleton, Farmwell Station, River Bend, and Trailside Middle Schools; the Academies of Loudoun; Thomas Jefferson High School for Science & Technology, and Phillips Exeter Academy; and Briar Woods, Broad Run, Riverside, Rock Ridge, and Stone Bridge High Schools) and more than 20 registered adult leaders.

Leadership

Troop 58 is a scout-led Troop. The Patrol Leaders Council (PLC) plans our Troop meetings and outings. Our Troop also supports formal leadership development for both Scouts and leaders through District, Council and National programs. Troop 58 has several Scouts who are members of the Order of the Arrow (Scouting's honor society) and has many graduates of Scouting's National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) and National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE).

Scout Advancement

In the first 6 years of Troop 58's existence, we are proud to have had 16 Scouts attain the rank of Eagle Scout; we expect to have 4 additional Eagle Scouts by year-end 2021! Our Patrol Leaders work with each patrol member to encourage and facilitate rank advancement. Many of our new Scouts attain rank through summer camp programs. Scouts are encouraged to earn merit badges individually or in groups. Over 75 merit badges are represented by Troop adults serving as merit badge counselors. Troop 58 holds Court of Honor ceremonies three times each year to recognize and celebrate the achievements of our Scouts.

Our Troop

We are Troop 58, serving Eastern Loudoun County. Founded in 2014, Troop 58 is one of the newest troops in Ashburn, Virginia, but has an active presence in the community. We split off from Troop 1158 in Ashburn several years ago, starting anew with Lord Robert Baden-Powell's idea that a smaller troop is a better troop.

Parent Participation
