Boy Scout Troop 58 - 2020 Year in Review

2020 was a great year for Troop 58 on its own; when you add in the upheaval that COVID-19 caused the troop and Scouting overall, our accomplishments are nothing short of remarkable. Although it was just our 7th year as a Troop, we accomplished some remarkable things guided by our vision – "Troop 58 provides life and leadership skills by encouraging advancement in a fun, friendly, and safe environment while serving the community and experiencing adventure."

- Growing/maintaining the Troop
 - Completed the year with a roster of 51 highly-engaged Scouts
 - o 90% of the Troop's members advanced one or more ranks
 - 158 merit badges earned by our Scouts; 4 more than in 2019 and an average of more than 3 per Scout
 - 2 Scouts achieved the rank of Eagle the highest rank in Scouting
 - 3 Scouts were elected to the Order of the Arrow (OA), Scouting's National Honor Society; all but 1 OA Ordeal event were cancelled in 2020 due to COVID-19, so only 1 scout fully completed the process of becoming an Arrowmen.
 - o Received Scouting's national Gold-level Journey to Excellence award
 - Held 2 Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops (ILST) sessions; this is the 1st level of Scouting's youth leadership development program
 - All National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT), the 2nd level of Scouting's youth leadership development program, sessions were cancelled in 2020 due to COVID-19, so 0 scouts attended.
 - All National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE), the 3rd level of Scouting's youth leadership development program, sessions were cancelled in 2020 due to COVID-19, so 0 scouts attended.
 - Improved the Troop's advanced Adult Leader training posture through several Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS), University of Scouting, and other course completions that ensure our adult leaders are fully trained for their positions.
 - Held 3 scouting/professional journey sessions where a former Washington Redskin football player, a US Air Force General, and a Secret Service Agent shared their perspectives on scouting and their careers
